In one of the books I read whilst on sabbatical, Peter Brown the distinguished historian, uses the phrase 'Let's linger on....'. I have been doing that during my time away.

Lingering gives us the opportunity to pay proper attention to things. The opposite, I suppose, is to hurry, and although the adverts

often encourage us to hurry, actually we should linger more than we probably do.

Being on sabbatical gave me the opportunity to linger – in reading, in thinking and praying, but also in time with friends, experiencing the being in places in Italy and Spain.

Advent and Christmas are seasons which invite us all to linger. Advent is the period of preparation for Christmas, and yes, it is about cards and present-buying and all that, but it is also to ready ourselves for celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ. Despite the fact that almost everyone celebrates on December 25th, those celebrations are less than they might be, unless they find a focus in Jesus.

Linger then on what Christmas is about. God becomes man. The eternal, transcendent God, maker of heaven and earth, comes to dwell among us. St. John's 'word' means something like pitching a tent. God comes to share our human life and to show us what God is truly like. When we gaze into the face of Jesus, a face of compassion and love, of mercy and joy, we are gazing on the face of God.

This "God among us" (Emmanuel) challenges us. First, to recognise his presence among us. God is not far and distant, but close and deep within us. Second, to respond to that presence with love and devotion. We come, like the shepherds and magi to worship the child in the manger, but also, thirdly, to follow his way of justice and peace. Our reverence at the crib leads us to the reverence of all who are in need. Christmas brings us to Bethlehem, but sends us out in our communities to share the good news, but to make a difference to those around us, near and far, by the way we live.

I hope you might linger in worship this Christmas and perhaps just come into church when it is quiet to pray at the Crib. To linger there and give thanks that God became man at Christmas.

The Twelve Days of Christmas

'On the first day of Christmas my true love gave to me....' goes the popular secular Christmas song.

However, some people believe (although there is no firm evidence to confirm this), that it was written as a mnemonic for English Catholics to teach the faith to their children, at a time when Catholicism was illegal in England. The symbolism is thought to go something like this:

Six geese a-laying	The six days of creation (Genesis 1)
Seven swans a-swimming	The Seven Sacraments (Baptism, the Eucharist, Confirmation, Absolution, Ordination, Marriage, Holy Unction)
Eight maids a-milking	The Eight Beatitudes (Matt. 5:3-11)
Nine ladies dancing	The nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: (Gal. 5: 22)
Ten lords a-leaping	The ten Commandments (Exodus 20)
Eleven pipers piping	The eleven faithful Apostles of Jesus Christ: (Matt.10: 1 – 4)
Twelve drummers drumming	Twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed






Apple Service 8th December 4.00pm
