### Al AHLI HOSPITAL, GAZA

The conflict between Israel and Palestine continues to cause devastation. The rights and wrongs of this ongoing dispute which frequently erupts in violence are complex and controversial. Although, as you might expect, I have my personal views, this is not the place to express them, but rather to tell you about an Anglican initiative in Gaza.

As I say, whatever the political and military background, Gaza has suffered greatly. According to UN statistics the 50-day conflict in the summer of last year claimed 2,131 lives including 501 children. 71 Israelis were killed. 18,000 homes were destroyed and 108,000 were left homeless. Again, quoting the UN: "Damage to public infrastructure was unprecedented,

leaving hundreds of thousands of people without adequate services, including electricity, clean water and quality healthcare."

The Diocese of Jerusalem (which covers Jordan, Palestine, Israel, Syria and Lebanon) provides healthcare and refuge for many Palestinians. The Al Ahli Hospital has 80 beds. The Archbishop of Jerusalem, Suehil Dawani, writes: "Al Ahli has distributed First Aid packages to community-based organisations to enable them to treat some of the injured. Long-term care at the hospital is needed for those with severe injuries, while thousands of people are receiving psycho-social support to deal with the impact of the war." The hospital is also working to contain the spread of disease and other hazards from damaged sanitation and water supplies.
