

These very familiar words for this hymn are a constant in our celebrations of Christmas. It may date back to the mediaeval period but is usually attributed to John Francis Wade (1711-86) whose version was in Latin. The simple reason being that he was a Catholic living in France. He was a supporter of Bonnie Prince Charlie and after the uprising of 1745 was crushed he fled to the Continent, where he

worked as a music teacher and composer. He may also have written the tune to which we sing these words. It is said that it is really an ode for the birth of a Jacobite prince!! We know it in a version translated by Frederick Oakley (1802-1880). He was an Anglican priest in Oxford, but, with John Henry Newman, left the Church of England for the Catholic Church.

The hymn calls us to travel in heart and mind, as it were, to Bethlehem, to see the Christ Child, and we are to come with joy and faith. For this child is to be adored – worshipped – for he is the Son of God. The second verse uses phrases from the Creed: 'God of God', 'Light of Light', begotten not created, and becoming man of the Virgin Mary. Then the choirs of angels, who sang to the shepherds above the fields near Bethlehem are joined by faithful Christians, for we too are citizens of heaven. 'Glory to God in the highest', echoes the angels' song. And having come to adore the Christ Child we greet the child 'born on this happy morning', for he is the eternal Word of God come to dwell among us.

But before we reach Christmas we have the season of Advent – preparing ourselves to celebrate the coming of the Christ Child, and also for the time when he will come again in glory at the end of time, when God will bring all things to their fulfilment in Him.

I hope in the midst of this busy time of the year, you will find time to ponder the coming of Christ, and I bid you come, not only to Bethlehem, but to Church to celebrate.

May Advent be a time of reflection for you and may your celebration of Christmas be filled with joy.



More about our special services this month:

December 6th - 4pm Apple Service. This is a service for all the family with prayers, readings and music. Everyone receives an apple with a candle in it which is then lit and is placed in a spiral on the floor.

December 22nd - 10.30 am Tree and Crib Service. Everyone is welcome to come along and help decorate the Christmas tree which will have been put up in the Church. The crib will also have been assembled with just some final touches needed. There will be a short service of blessing, the singing of one or two carols and then we will finish with suitable seasonal refreshments (what else!). This service is primarily aimed at our younger members of the parish but is for 'youngsters' of all ages and, if previous years are anything to go by will be enjoyed by everyone.



The Christmas Carol Service will be on Tuesday 22nd December at 7.30pm. This will be a traditional service of readings and carols, followed by light refreshments in church.



THE PETER AND PAUL APPEAL Restoring Our Parish Church in King's Sutton



What a *super* start! The generosity of people in King's Sutton, Astrop and around has come up trumps. Financial circumstances vary, so donations have varied. They are *all* marks of individuals' generosity and love for our church, its spire and its iconic place in the village. We're pretty confident that those donations and others to come, along with a grant we have received from a charitable trust, will allow a start in the spring on work on the tower and spire, the first focus of the appeal.

As was hoped, we can now look to other necessary work (mentioned in the first information about the appeal) – leaking roofs, repair to weathered stonework and windows, decoration – and have you seen the bulging churchyard walls?

None of this comes cheap – we'll need around another £100,000 to reach our overall goal of £250,000. So, inspired by the spire, we are into the second phase of the Peter and Paul Appeal. Fund raising events are in the pipe line. There's already been a concert and a French Impressionist Evening. Charities and grant making bodies are being approached. Collecting boxes are in the pubs.

And, if you've thought about, but not yet made, your own personal donation – out with the cheque book! (Cheques to: 'King's Sutton Parish Church Appeal'). Gift Aid forms and envelopes are available in the church. Donations through the Vicarage letter box in Church Avenue. Roger Bellamy (Vicar), Peter Allen (Churchwarden), Stephen Allday, John Duncan, and Roger Neill (appeal coordinator) are all happy to talk about the scheme.
