As I write this I am about to begin the 6th cycle of treatment. I have to say that the cumulative effects mean that my levels of energy, especially in the first two weeks of the three-week cycle, become lower. However, on the whole I am doing OK.

When it was decided that I wouldn't retire this September but would continue till 2018 I didn't know that cancer would strike again! However, I was thinking about what I might do in these two additional years. And my thoughts have been confirmed by the way in which the parish, and especially the Wardens and the PCC, have managed things during the past few months. I am immensely grateful to all those who have taken on additional tasks.

But let me tell you another story about Archbishop Michael Ramsey! The first was last month!!

He was visiting a city parish for a mission – this was when he was the Bishop of Durham – and after the inaugural service, it was decided that photos should be taken (this was long before the ubiquitous phone/camera). However, the Bishop seemed to have disappeared. He wasn't in the church; he wasn't in the loo. But then the vicar had an idea. He went round the back of the church

where there was some rough ground where local youths congregated, and there, chatting to a bunch of lads was the Bishop! He was whisked away for the photos, but asked what he had been talking about with the youths. "About God, of course", said the Bishop. And that is fundamentally what I want to do much more of during these two years. Details will follow in October but I am thinking of arranging opportunities for both individuals and groups to come together simply to talk together about God.

It is right and good that the Church is involved not only in worship but also in social activity — the loving of God and neighbour and especially those in particular need — the sick, the poor, those whose lives are blighted by the conditions in which they live. But we must never forget our task to speak to others about God. So I hope that those of you who read this but do not regularly attend church might think this is for you! Look out for details next month.

Harvest

We are celebrating Harvest on Sunday September 25th with an All Age Service - that means what it says! The service, like those on Christmas Day and Easter Day is designed for people from 0 - 100! So this is an opportunity



for us all to come together, children, parents, the usual 8.00am and 11.00am congregations, those that come to Family Worship and those that come to the Parents and Toddlers worship services. And anyone else that wants to come along and enjoy a Harvest Eucharist but in a slightly different way!

At Harvest we collect tinned and dry, packaged goods for homeless young people through the BYHP charity based in Banbury. This year we shall be handing out shoe boxes to anyone that wants one, including the younger members of the congregation, with a request that they are filled with the necessary goodies for BYHP. These filled shoe boxes will be presented at the 11.00am service, blessed and then taken to the BYHP offices in Banbury.

If you prefer, or even in addition, you can make donations for Christian Aid, helping poorer people across the world; Christian Aid envelopes will be handed out at the service.

Please come and make it a real Christian Family occasion. And there will be refreshments at the end of the service, with donations going to two of our other charities that we support: Maggie's Centre, Oxford and the Primary Bereavement Service. So at one service four separate charities will benefit from 'our' Harvest.

PTW: We are constantly faced by groups of capital letters that may or may These three letters stand for PARENTS AND not make a word. TODDLERS' WORSHIP. It happens on Friday mornings in term time at 9.30am roughly! Those who come are Parents, mainly Mums, I have to say, but Dads and Grandparents and other carers are all welcome, and then there are the Toddlers - children as young as a few weeks up to school-going age. And what do we do? The answer is partly in the title. We gather in church, we light some candles, and we sing songs, hear a Bible story and pray. The blowing out of the candles is a skill the children learn quickly! And then, we move to the Church Room for refreshments. There are toys for the children and the parents chat. If you are a parent and want your child to learn something of the Christian faith, to discover that church can be fun and that the building is a place where they are welcome, then this is something for you. If you want to know more please contact me or talk to Carole Hill who is our children's worker, and who is leading these services at the moment.

FW: This is another of our abbreviations and it is for Families. Now what is a family? Well any group of people. These FAMILY WORSHIP services, which happen at 10am on the 4th Sunday of every month, are opportunities to worship in an informal way, with songs, percussion instruments, stories and some activities. The service itself lasts up to 30 minutes and then again there are refreshments either in the Vicarage or the Church Room. Everyone is welcome at these services whether you are 5, 15, 25, 85 and whether you come with others or on your own. For the moment these **FW** services are being led by Stephen Connelly and Dee Thobourne.

Please come along and enjoy a **PTW** or a **FW** experience. The Church has the message of God's love and we want to share that with everyone.

You will see that on September 25th the Family Worship is combining with the 11am Mass for Harvest. But 'normal' service will resume on October 23rd at 10am.

SPIRE UPDATE

Whilst doing this work the contractors have found rather more work that is unsafe and therefore needs to be remedied than was at first thought. The south east pinnacle was very dangerous and we are fortunate that this did not break off and cause further damage. Because of this there will be a delay in completion but it seems only right and proper that all this work gets sorted now rather than having to go through something similar in a

couple of years time. Of course there is an additional cost implication as the work that is now being discovered was not in the original specification. The overall cost is likely to be in the region of £130k which is approximately £30k up on the original quotation.

Completion date i.e. when everything is off site, scaffolding down and gone and the Church is ours again is 23rd September. This is some eight weeks later than the first indication but takes in the additional work as already mentioned.

CELEBRATION

There will be a short act of worship in **Celebration** of completion of the work done on **Sunday 9th October at 3pm** when everyone will be invited to attend, architects, contractors, benefactors, village community, anyone that has donated both large and small and in fact anyone that has contributed in any way for making sure this project came to a successful conclusion. Please note this date in your diary and make every effort to attend with as many family members and friends as you can muster. Please do come and join in....tea and cakes will be available.

Photographic examples of the old stonework as well as the new bits that have replaced them will be on view; and there will be plenty of opportunity to ask questions of the Architects and Contractors.
